REPORT TO TOUR DEPARTURE AREA 30 MINUTES PRIOR TO TOUR LEAVING

2026 CONVENTION TOUR DESCRIPTIONS



Each night, the hotel restaurant is open until 11 p.m., and a midsize store with food and drink is open until 1 a.m. NOTE: All tour bus driver tips are covered by TCA.

MONDAY, JUNE 22, 2026



Tour #1—Train ride from Grapevine, Texas, to Fort Worth Stockyards, and two layouts

COST \$125 (*Lunch & Museum fees not included*)

TIME 9 AM–8 PM (15 minutes travel one way)

“TRAVEL BACK IN TIME” on the *Grapevine Vintage Railroad (GVRR)* to the days of the OLD WEST at the historic **FORT WORTH STOCKYARDS**, featuring unique museums, shops, and eateries.

We leave the hotel at 9:00 a.m. for a 15-minute shuttle bus trip to Grapevine. View the *Lone Star Hi-Railers*’ club train layout in the *Convention & Visitors Bureau*. Two blocks away is a 1950s-era baggage car, in which the *Lone Star Hi-Railers* has a second layout running the length of the car.



Next to the baggage car, we have the steam engine 771 & Tender owned by the *Grapevine Vintage Railroad (GVRR)* in Grapevine, Texas, a historic 2-8-2 MK-5 Class “Mikado” steam locomotive. It was built for the *Texas & New Orleans Railroad* by the *Baldwin Locomotive Works* in Philadelphia, PA, in 1913 (#750-#774). They were originally lettered for the *Galveston, Harrisburg & San Antonio Railroad*.

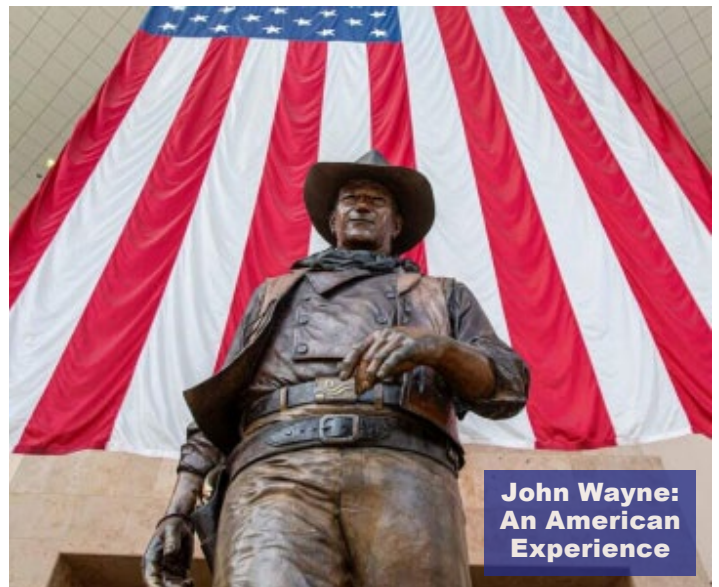
The GVRR backshop is next door.

We arrive in a covered Food Court. All main attractions, museums, and eating establishments are on East Exchange Ave., within two short blocks of the train loading. The only exception is *Billy Bob’s Texas*, the world’s largest honky tonk, one block from *John Wayne: An American Experience*.

Billy Bob’s patrons can visit the Wall of Fame and see the handprints and autographs of Garth Brooks, Willie Nelson, Johnny Cash, and even Ringo Starr, to name a few. Many fans enjoy comparing their hand size to that of the celebrities. Food is available here. Admission to Billy Bob’s is \$4.



Allow one hour for **John Wayne: An American Experience**, which displays many documents and artifacts showcasing the Duke's iconic career and personal life. Admission is: Adults: \$22.95; Youth (6–15): \$17.95; Children (5 & under): FREE. *Discounted Tickets—Military, Students, and Seniors (65 & older): \$20.95 (offered with ID).* Next door is the Stockyards Exchange Building, which you can walk through with the \$3 Stockyards Museum admission.



Real Texas cowhands lead a herd of legendary longhorns down East Exchange in the Stockyards every day at 11:30 a.m. and 4 p.m. We will see the 4 p.m. cattle drive. It's free for all, and every detail, from the drovers' saddles and chaps to their boots and hats, embodies authentic Texas heritage.



All other attractions in the area are free or \$3.00.

America's second-favorite book has a first-class museum in Cleburne. ***Gone With The Wind*** was released nearly Winter 2026

90 years ago, but remains popular enough to draw thousands of visitors to the museum.

The ***Gone With The Wind Remembered Museum*** is a not-for-profit company. It houses one of the most comprehensive and extensive collections of GWTW memorabilia in the world.

Vicky Lynn Rogers has been collecting these items for over 30 years. There are many original one-of-a-kind pieces, as well as extremely rare items. One such piece is the mourning bonnet worn by Scarlett O'Hara, one of the most iconic costume pieces from the movie.



The museum is a state-of-the-art, climate-controlled, specially lit, and spacious facility. As the world-renowned film nears its 80th Anniversary, book and movie fans alike are able to journey back in time and experience the history of a civil war novel published in 43 languages and 53 countries, and a movie that changed filmmaking for all time.

Throughout the world, the book and film have influenced people's ideas about Southern history. We hope you will reminisce with us and savor what you see.

The next stop is a "drive by" and short photo op at the AT&SF Steam Locomotive #3417. "The Spirit of Cleburne" is

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 24, 2026

Tour #3—Frisco/Plano, Texas: Museum of the American Railroad, Southfork Ranch, Interurban Railway Museum, and two layouts

COST \$115 (*Lunch is not included*)

TIME 8 AM–6 PM (½ hour travel one way)

The *Museum of the American Railroad* contains more than 70 pieces of steam, diesel, passenger, and freight railroad equipment. Formerly known as the *Age of Steam Railroad Museum*, it occupies 15 acres in Frisco, Texas, making it one of the largest historic rail collections in the U.S.

The indoor museum, called *TrainTopia*, houses a G-scale & O-scale model train layout in the *Frisco Discovery Center*.



#3417 "Spirit of Cleburne"

a Pacific-type (4-6-2) steam locomotive. It was delivered to the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe (AT&SF) Railway Company in 1919 and assigned to Cleburne Passenger Service for most of its 35 years, and two million miles of active operation. The engine was retired by the AT&SF and donated to the city in 1955.

We will then travel to Granbury, Texas, to see **David Kross'** 40' x 60' O gauge 1950s-era layout that highlights Union Pacific and ATSF in a ground-level (one step only) 40' x 80' building. The remainder of the building is filled with railroad memorabilia.

Lunch will be at various restaurants in Historic Downtown Granbury, Texas (*lunch is not included*).

As we head back to the hotel, we will stop off at **James Barnett's** 18' x 16' O gauge layout set on Labor Day 1960. It has two connected main lines, featuring overhead catenary on the lower level with one main line on the upper level. *It is located in his basement, and while the steps are easy to navigate, this tour stop is not ADA-compliant.*



This layout is next to the museum's outdoor static display site that includes the Union Pacific #4018 Big Boy 4-8-8-4, plus at least six other notable steam engines along with UP diesel engine #6913, an EMD DDA40X built in 1969 (the "Centennial"), an EMD F7 built in 1952 (formerly Canadian National #9167, repainted into Santa Fe Red Warbonnet colors), and a Pennsylvania Railroad class GG1 #4903.

You will also see many other diesel engines, passenger cars, box cars, and tank cars. *Note: Uneven walkways are present in some sections of the outdoor static display.*



Thirty minutes away, we will go to **Southfork Ranch**, famously home to the Ewing family from the popular television series **Dallas**, for a guided tour of the iconic Ewing Mansion and historic ranch grounds.

Lunch is on your own in various nearby restaurants.



Plano Station, Texas Electric Railway, now known as the **Interurban Railway Museum**, is a historic train station in Plano, Texas. It is still served by the Downtown Plano station on the Dallas Area Rapid Transit light rail, which reutilized the interurban's right-of-way.

We will then go to **Bob Carter's** 19'x19' two-elevation O-gauge layout, constructed and installed by **TW TrainWorx** of Dallas. *This layout is on the 2nd floor. Not ADA-compliant.*

The last stop for the day is **Rick Elliott's** O gauge 7'x10' train layout with two main lines. The layout was constructed and installed by **TW TrainWorx**. *Not ADA-compliant.*

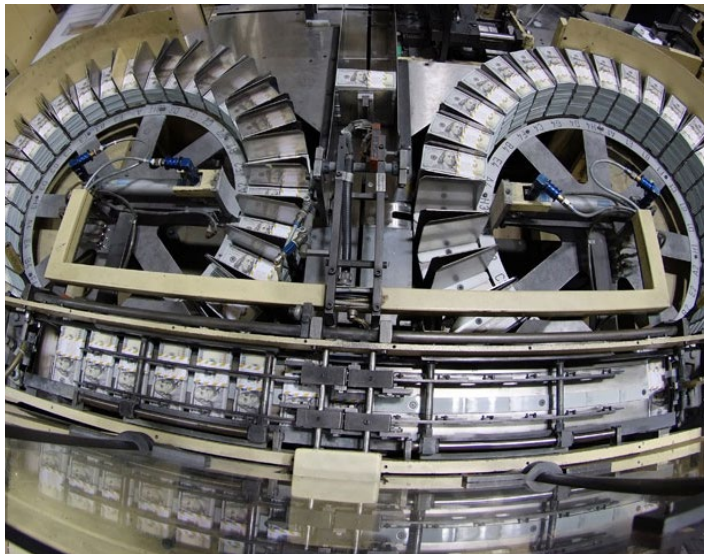
Tour #4—Fort Worth, Texas: Bureau of Engraving & Printing Western Currency Facility, DFW Car & Toy Museum, Amon Carter Museum of American Art, Fort Worth Museum of Science & History, Texas & Pacific Railway Passenger Depot

COST \$85 (*Lunch is not included*)

TIME 8 AM–6 PM (½ hour travel one way)



Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP) Western Currency Facility in Fort Worth is one of only two locations in the U.S. that print paper money, producing over half the nation's currency.



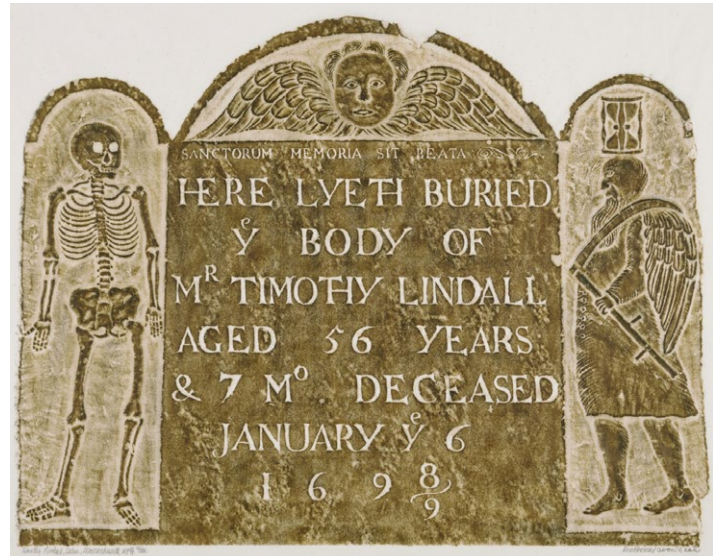
Tour the printing process from an elevated walkway, explore interactive exhibits, watch a film, and buy souvenirs at the Moneyfactory Gift Shop. The facility opened in 1990 to serve western states and act as a backup to the plant in Washington, D.C. *No cameras, cell phones, or pets are allowed on the tour.*

DFW Car and Toy Museum has 200 rare collectible cars and 3,000 rare and antique toys in a 150,000-square-foot facility, designed with museum-quality climate control.



Lunch in various restaurants. (*Lunch is not included*)

The Amon Carter Museum of American Art (also known as the *Carter*) permanent collection features paintings, photography, sculpture, and works on paper by leading artists working in the United States and its North American territories in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries.



The greatest concentration of works falls into the period from the 1820s through the 1940s, including photographs, prints, and other works. The collection was built around portrayals of the Old West, including more than 300 works of art by **Frederic Remington** and **Charles M. Russell**. It was assembled by Fort Worth newspaper publisher and philanthropist Amon G. Carter, Sr. (1879–1955).

The **Georgia O'Keeffe** exhibit brings together the Museum's holdings of paintings and works on paper by one of America's most influential modern artists.

The **Fort Worth Museum of Science and History** engages our diverse community through creative, vibrant programs and exhibits interpreting science and the stories of Texas and the Southwest. It is 166,000 sq. ft. of engaging gallery space. The Museum holds DinoLabs and DinoDig, Innovation Studios, the Children's Museum, Energy Blast, and the **Cattle Raiser's Museum**.



On the way back to the hotel, we will stop by the seven-story *Texas & Pacific Railway Passenger Depot* and their corporate offices for a quick photo opportunity. It was built in 1931 and served as a passenger terminal, later undergoing conversion into luxury condominiums in 1999.
